CONTEST INFORMATION AND POSTER GUIDELINES

- ❖ Up to ten poster submissions will be chosen based on the following criteria: originality, implications for further study, impact on the field, creative use of methodologies, and overall ability to articulate key concepts. Graduate students must submit their abstract for a poster through ARCE's online submission process via All Academic <http://convention2.allacademic.com/one/arce/arce17/>. Advisors must sign off on the abstract submission; instruction emails will be sent to all advisors. Abstracts are limited to 250 words.
- ❖ Abstracts can be on any subject related to ancient or modern Egyptian studies. Please refer to the categories listed on the Call for Papers at the All Academic site.
- ❖ **Graduate students submitting a Student Poster must be current members of ARCE.** ARCE membership information is available on our website, www.arce.org.
- ❖ When submitting your abstract, please be sure that your submission is under the Poster category. You will be prompted during the submission process to include your advisors name, email, and university. Failure to do so may result in disqualification.
- ❖ All submissions will be blind vetted by the Review Committee. The Review Committee is made up of scholars selected by the ARCE Annual Meeting Committee. Submitters to the Graduate Student Poster Session will be notified of acceptance or rejection by February 3, 2017.
- ❖ The Chapter Council is generously underwriting the registration for the student submitters selected for poster presentation in the Graduate Student Poster Award contest. Students selected to compete must contact the ARCE office by February 17, 2017 to confirm participation in the contest. Failure to contact the office by the February 17th date may result in disqualification.
- ❖ Posters cannot be accompanied by technical devices of any kind (e.g. laptops, digital projectors, instrumentation devices, etc.). The area for display of an accepted poster is 3'9" (h) x 3'6" (w). Students are encouraged to consult with their professors for guidance on appropriate formats. Students are responsible for displaying their poster; tacks will be provided by ARCE. Accepted posters must be mounted by Friday, April 21 at 8:00am. Posters will be available for viewing from 8:30am Friday, April 21 through Sunday, April 23 at 1:00pm. Students are responsible for removing their posters at the conclusion of the Annual Meeting.
- ❖ The awards for the Best Graduate Student Posters will be presented at the ARCE Member Dinner Reception, Saturday, April 22 at the Intercontinental at the Plaza Hotel, Kansas City, MO.
